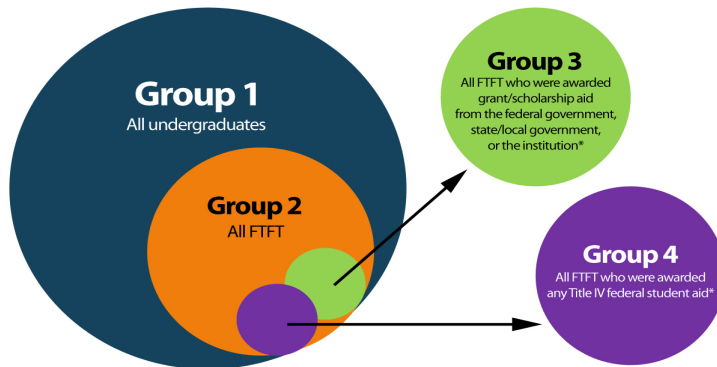
Overview

IPEDS Student Financial Aid Component Overview - Public Academic Reporters

Welcome to the Student Financial Aid (SFA) component. The purpose of the SFA component is to collect information about financial aid provided to various groups of undergraduate students and military/veteran educational benefits for all students at your institution.

Data Reporting Reminders:

- Report data to accurately reflect the time period corresponding with the IPEDS survey component, even if such reporting is seemingly inconsistent with prior-year reporting. For example, if a summer term began later than usual due to Coronavirus Pandemic postponements, continue to report using the timeframes as defined in the IPEDS instructions. NCES expects that some data reported during the 2021-22 data collection year will vary from established prior trends due to the impacts of Coronavirus Pandemic. - COA Revisions
Revisions to Cost of Attendance (COA) used to calculate the net price of attendance can be made in this component. Consult the instructions and screens to make sure you are reporting the correct aid amounts for the correct groups of students.
- College Affordability and Transparency Lists
Net price amounts calculated in SFA will be used to populate the U.S. Department of Education's College Affordability and Transparency lists.
- Interactive Edits and Error Messages
SFA contains interactive edits that will check for blank fields, invalid values, or values that fall outside expected ranges. Some error messages will require you to confirm or explain the values that you entered.
