- USF St. Petersburg is classified as Master's Colleges & Universities: Medium Programs.
- USF Sarasota-Manatee is classified as Master's Colleges & Universities: Small Programs.

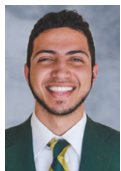

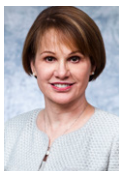

The USF Board of Trustees is responsible for cost-effective policy decisions appropriate to the system mission and the implementation and maintenance of high-quality education programs within the laws and rules of the state. Campus Boards for USF St. Petersburg and USF Sarasota-Manatee are appointed by the USF Board of Trustees. The USF Board of Trustees was created in 2001 by the Florida legislature.

The 13 trustees include distinguished figures in accounting, banking, business, education, law, technology, philanthropy and public policy leadership. Six trustees are appointed by Florida's governor, and five trustees are appointed by the Florida Board of Governors. The USF System Faculty Council President and USF System Student Advisory Council President also serve as trustees. The USF System President serves as Corporate Secretary.

USF SYSTEM STUDENTS

- USF's fall 2018 Freshman academic profile posts an average SAT score of 1283 and a high school GPA of 4.09.
- The Morsani College of Medicine brought in its most selective incoming medical student cohort to date, with an average MCAT score of 515, placing it among the top of all medical schools in the country.
- The University of South Florida System is home to a student body of 50,755 students representing over 145 different countries.
- USF ranks #14 in student success among 1,100 public research and doctoral universities according to the 2017 Eduventures Student Success Ratings.
- USF Tampa is recognized by The Education Trust as being #6 in the nation for eliminating the completion gap between black and white students, #4 in the nation for Latino student success, and #1 in the state of Florida for both (2017).
- USF Tampa is recognized as #1 by *The Chronicle of Higher Education* (2017) for greatest improvement in 6-year graduation rates among 4-year public colleges and universities.
- USF Tampa is a recognized "Top Producer" of Peace Corps Volunteers, ranking 3rd in the Nation (among Graduate Schools) for Peace Corps Volunteers in 2018.
- The USF System was home to 63 national scholarship and fellowship student awardees during the 2017-18 academic year including Boren, Fulbright, Gilman, and Goldwater.

USF SYSTEM RESEARCH & FINANCES

- The USF System reached \$568 million in total research expenditures in fiscal year 2016/17 according to the National Science Foundation *HERD Survey*.
- The USF System ranks 1st in Florida, 5th in the nation among public universities and 12th worldwide for granted U.S. patents among all universities according to the Intellectual Property Owners Association/NAI (2017), and has ranked in the Top 10 among public universities for U.S. patents granted for the past eight years (2010-2017).
- USF ranked 4th worldwide for organizations with the most Fellows of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) named in 2017, a rank USF has held for the past four years. As of 2018 USF has a total of 60 AAAS Fellows among its faculty.
- USF's innovation and economic development efforts generate more than \$400 million in statewide impact each year, sustain more than 3,000 jobs, and return more than \$52 million in tax revenue to local, state, and federal coffers, according to a 2016 analysis from the Washington Economics Group, a leading national firm.
- USF Tampa was ranked #19 among the "Best Universities for Technology Transfer" by the prestigious Milken Institute (2017).

Offering more than 40 graduate and undergraduate programs in the arts and sciences, business and education, USF St. Petersburg (USFSP) is Pinellas County's only residential public research university. USFSP features small classes taught by faculty who challenge their students to excel through innovative approaches to learning and collaborative research opportunities. Located in downtown St. Petersburg, USFSP offers distinct opportunities for all students to engage with the community through internships and field-based experiences.
